

# Everybody's talking about.... A1 (Look for an event about A1 coming up on the club calendar soon)

Everybody's talking about Artificial Intelligence (AI) these days. You'd have to be living on another planet not to have heard the term.

But what exactly do people mean by it?

A deceptively simple answer might be: based on data already inputted, the ability of a machine to "think" for itself when given a problem to solve, or an action to carry out.

In other words, a machine that to a certain degree can think and act like a human being. That's to say, a special kind of robot.

The possibility of such robots evolving, and becoming more and more like humans, and eventually even replacing them, is a concept that has long fascinated writers of science fiction.

It's now more than three quarters of a century since Isaac Asimov wrote his seminal book I, robot, in which he pointed to the dangers that machines that could think for themselves would pose for humans.

Back then, not many people took him and his three laws of robotics seriously. It was all just fantasy, they said.

Today the situation is very different. Nobody is saying Al is just fantasy. It is reality. A reality that is already impacting people's lives in all sorts of ways, shaping the world with consequences both negative and positive.



Al is a revolution, with a significance that will perhaps sooner than we think be recognized as greater than that of the Industrial Revolution of the 18th century.

But meanwhile, the biggest question of all remains unanswered: could a machine ever step outside the confines imposed on it by the data it is provided with, and become truly autonomous? With a consciousness comparable to a human being's?

No doubt if he were still around to bear witness, Isaac Asimov would have much to say on the subject.
